a stronger sense of connection to the country. Sikhism, the dominant religion here plays a significant role in shaping the region's rich cultural heritage.

Uttarakhand

[Uttarakhand](#) is a prime destination for adventure sports in India. It is also where the historic Chipko movement took place. The state is renowned for housing the sacred Char Dham pilgrimage sites—**Kedarnath, Badrinath, Gangotri, and Yamunotri**. Additionally, Uttarakhand hosts the **Kumbh Mela**, a major religious gathering held every 12 years.

Haryana

Gurugram, Haryana, serves as the base for the Indian headquarters of almost all major multinational companies. Haryana is also known for producing the highest number of wrestlers in the country. In the northern region of India lies Delhi, the national capital, celebrated for its rich food and diverse culture. The city is home to numerous historical monuments. The **Indira Gandhi International Airport** stands as the largest aviation hub in South Asia. North India also boasts the highest population density in the country. At a staggering altitude of 6,000 metres, the **Siachen Glacier** is home to the world's highest battlefield. In the field of astronomy, the **Indian Astronomical Observatory** is the second-highest in the world. The **Kalka-Shimla Railway** has earned a spot on UNESCO's list of World Heritage Sites, under the Mountain Railways of India. Remarkably, **Pushkar, Rajasthan**, houses the world's only Brahma Temple and is also known for its famous hot air balloon festival. The highest post office in the world operates in **Hikkim, Himachal Pradesh**, perched at an altitude of 15,500 feet. The town of **Drass** in Kargil, often called the 'Gateway to Ladakh,' is the second coldest inhabited place on Earth. The renowned **Kumbh Mela** in Allahabad, Uttar Pradesh, holds the record for the largest human gathering in history, with crowds so vast they were captured by a satellite in space. The **Lathmar Holi** festivities in Mathura and

Vrindavan draw international attention, with a week-long celebration full of colours and sweets. Finally, during **Diwali**, the North Indian landscape is illuminated so brightly that it can be observed from space.
